THE MOP FAIR - ROAD CLOSURE

Wood Street Car Park Closure

As in previous years, Coventry Street, High Street and Market Hill will be closed on the occasion of the Mop Fair on **Monday 19th October 2009** from 9.30am to 12 o'clock midnight. During the time of the road closure vehicular access will not be allowed to premises except for emergencies.

The roads will be closed at the following points:-

The bottom of Market Hill to allow free movement to traffic from Warwick Road and Oxford Street.

Outside the Bowling Green car park to give access to Heather Close and Meadow Road.

Daventry Street junction with High Street, - Pendicke Street, Bull Street and Craven Lane will only be accessible from Daventry Street.

No access to Market Hill from Park Lane.

No access to Wood Street car park from High Street or Daventry Street

Stratford District Council has permitted the Mop Fair to use the Wood Street car park from Sunday lunchtime. Please make sure your vehicle is moved from Wood Street car park by 12 noon on Sunday 18th October.

HOW MUCH ARE TOWN COUNCILLORS PAID?

Town and Parish Councils are the most local level of government in England. They are independent of other levels of local government though maintaining a close working relationship with both District and County Councils.

The government recognises that "Being a town or community councillor is a very rewarding role that requires a high level of commitment." Councillors have to abide by a local government Code of Conduct and declare a personal or prejudicial interest if they have an interest in any matter under discussion at a Town Council meeting.

Since the Local Government Act 2000 Town Councillors may be paid for their services. It will be reassuring for the townsfolk of Southam to know that **members of the Southam Town Council receive no remuneration . Their commitment and time is given freely without reward or favour.**

HAVE YOU HEARD OF THE COMMUNITY LINKS BUS SERVICE?

It is door to door service for all residents who are 'stuck for transport'. Community Links is designed for all residents of Stratford on Avon District who:

- Have genuine need for local transport
- Cannot access public transport because of mobility or other reasons
- Live in an isolated location with no other form of transport available

Does this apply to you, or someone you know? If so then please read on....

The service operates on weekdays between about 9.30 am and 2.45 pm, focusing on various parts of the district on different days. Customers' phone the office three days in advance to book a journey and the team will then plan travel routes for each day. They will do their best to meet your needs, but cannot always do so. Community Links does not work to a set timetable as do other bus services but changes daily according to demand.

All vehicles have disability access and the necessary safety features and customers are charged a flat rate of £1.30 for a single journey and £2.60 return (prices correct at 1st April 2009) Family or informal carers, who wish to travel with the person they are supporting, can travel free of charge.

MET OFFICE EMAIL ALERT SERVICE

The Met Office now offers its web site visitors an email alert service for weather warnings.

Weather warnings are issued by the Met Office as **Flash, Early or Advisory** warnings.

Warnings are issued and updated on a regular basis and cover a range of dates and times. During an active spell of severe weather, especially heavy rain, it is possible that you will receive a number of alerts on a daily basis which reflects the dynamic weather situation as it evolves.

It is not currently possible to receive warnings for just one Unitary Authority and you will receive all warnings for the Region that you have subscribed to.



RAFT (Residents Against Flood Threat)

A meeting of the Southam RAFT group took place on Monday 21st September 2009.

On the agenda was flood alleviation, the proposed installation on an early warning system in Southam, the setting up of a network of contacts to receive and pass on warnings when the River Stowe rises to a dangerous level and the obtaining of the best prices for insurance in flood risk areas.

Volunteers are being sort to serve on the committee, ideally at least one from each flood risk area, and to take an active role in future RAFT projects including a 'River Watch Group'.

SWITCH IT OFF 2009

Calling on people from all over Coventry, Warwickshire and Worcestershire to take part in this years Switch It Off campaign. This will run during the week beginning the 9th of November, finishing with the Big Switch Off scheduled for Friday 13th November between 4:30-6:30. The campaign is designed to show the electrical savings that can be achieved when a lot of people turn off unwanted lights and electrical appliances left on standby. If everyone across the three regions joins in we could expect to save about £23 million a year; just by switching off items left on standby.

According to the Energy Saving Trust nationally 71% of people regularly leave items on standby in their homes and 65% of people leave lights on in rooms they are not using. Video, set top boxes, televisions and even the clocks on microwaves are using surprisingly high amounts of power everyday in our homes. The average family spends £400 a year on electricity and up to 25% can be slashed from this by being more energy aware and switching off unused appliances.

Anyone travelling with an expired EHIC card is putting themselves at risk.
