

ALARMING SALES TACTICS

ADVICE FROM TRADING STANDARDS

Over the years, many consumers have had problems with companies selling expensive home alarm systems door to door that aren't always what they are cracked up to be. Unfortunately the elderly and vulnerable are often targeted. Tactics employed by salesmen include:

- The use of dubious crime/fire statistics, and tales of robbery and assault to scare householders into buying.
- Telling the householder that new legislation will prevent them obtaining contents insurance if they do not have a monitored alarm. This is not
- Pretending to be calling on behalf of the Trading Standards, Fire and Rescue Service, Police or Neighbourhood Watch in order to make their visit appear official.
- Offering 'free' monitored alarms. The householder is told they have either won or been selected for an alarm. Although this may seem at first to be a tempting offer, what is not always made clear to householders who take up this offer is that they will have to pay a service charge to whichever company monitors the alarm system that is fitted - and this could be hundreds of pounds a year.

Consumers who sign any contract in the home or place of work have a 7 day period in which to change their minds and cancel.

Local Police Crime Prevention Officers are only too willing to give the public advice on home security.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

JUNE

It was resolved that the Council would agree to joining other parishes in contributing to the employment of an additional Enforcement Officer to tackle the problem of dog fouling in the town.

Council also agreed to partially fund the Summer Buzz activities taking place at the Graham Adams Centre during the summer.

The results of the Speed Aware Campaign were noted and forwarded to the Community Forum for action.

JULY

Representations from the public included; support for a planning application, information requests on road closures .difficulties that the closures cause to bus users and a complaint that the bunting on Market Hill is looking very untidy.

In partnership with Positive about Young People and following the popularity of the mobile skate park at the Southam Games in July, the Town Council resolved to contribute £500 towards the cost of three more skate sessions during the summer holidays.

With regret, the Council accepted the resignation of Cllr Dave Wise from the Town Council. A casual vacancy has been advertised and will have been filled by co-option at the September meeting. At the time of writing, two applications have been received for the vacancy.

SWITCH ON & ROAD CLOSURES

The Christmas Lights Switch On takes place on Friday 30th November 2012.

Coventry Street and High Street, between Daventry Road and Meadow Road will be closed to all but emergency traffic between the hours of 2pm and 12 midnight.

DOORSTEP SELLERS

It is worth noting that anyone calling at your door and selling items 'on the spot' requires a Peddlers Certificate from Warwickshire Police.

The Certificate should include a description of the person, age, height, hair colour, eye colour and complexion and his/ her full name and address The Certificate is valid for one year and will show the expiry date.

If you are in any doubt or if someone does not have the required Certificate please contact Warwickshire Police on 101 and leave details with the call handler.
